ecoAmerica's National Faith + Climate Forum 2025 Draws 2,000+ Attendees

Washington, DC — More than 2,000 faith leaders, advocates, and community members came together on March 27 for the [National Faith + Climate Forum 2025](#), a landmark gathering that inspired bold, faith-rooted action on climate change. Hosted by ecoAmerica's Blessed Tomorrow program, the distributed event featured live programming and activation sessions for over 80 host locations across 32 states — from fire-ravaged Alta Dena, CA to Asheville, NC, and small and large cities nationwide — and a robust group of online attendees.

Renowned conservationist **Dr. Jane Goodall**, DBE, Founder of the Jane Goodall Institute and UN Messenger of Peace, and **Senator Reverend Raphael Warnock** (D-GA) delivered compelling keynote addresses. Both called on faith communities to lead with hope, courage, and action in the face of the climate crisis.

"When many people make even small ethical choices..., cumulatively this will move us to a better and fairer, and more sustainable world," said **Dr. Goodall** in her address.

"What's good for our ecology is also good for our economy," said **Senator Warnock**.

"At a time when the prevailing assumption is that people of faith do not believe in climate change, the National Faith + Climate Forum showed us the truth, that most people of faith are concerned and helping to advance climate action in their congregations and communities across the nation," said **Rev. Carol Devine**, **Director** of ecoAmerica's Blessed Tomorrow program.

The 2025 Forum featured [18 inspiring speakers](#) who supported the integration of creation care into the faith lives of congregations and people of faith. **Rt. Rev. Francine A. Brookins, Esq.**, Presiding Bishop 5th Episcopal District, and **Rev. Dr. Miriam Burnett**, Supervisor of Missions 5th Episcopal District of the African Methodist Episcopal Church shared the story of the impacts on the community of the recent LA fires and the strength and hope provided by First AME Church of Pasadena, CA in the aftermath. Attendees left with inspiration, practical tools and resources, and access to seed grants to implement climate action in their communities and congregations.
