*The Teach Climate Network provides virtual and in-person professional development, inspiration, and community networking to improve and teach climate change in all disciplines, grade levels, and educational settings.*

Along with a free online classroom-ready resource and curriculum library, the Teach Climate Network hosts an annual (virtual) Conference for educators teaching climate literacy and paid opportunities to participate in small working groups to create and pilot new resources and virtual workshops. They aim to:

- Build confident climate-literate educators
- Lead a network of formal and non-formal educators
- Create new instructional and curricular resources that support educators teaching intersectional and interdisciplinary climate change education and
- Support an anti-racist educator community by connecting educators to stories of leadership and climate change solutions from racially, economically, and socially marginalized communities, including youth, communities of color, and low-income communities
